The Connecticut College Student Judiciary Board requires all students enrolled in courses to sign the Academic and Social Honor Code Pledge.

It is the responsibility of all students to be aware of the following regulations:

1. Violations of the Examination Procedures:

Breaches shall be treated as Honor Code Infractions. The following are among those actions considered a breach of the examination procedure:

- Communicating by any form within the test room, bringing into the examination room any items not pertinent to the exam (pertinent items are writing materials and items particularly designated by the instructor), and creating excessive noise within and around the examination centers.

- Failure to return the exam by the end of the stated exam sessions (12:00 noon, 5:00 pm and 10:00 pm).
- Failure to return the examination guestions.
